




지난 5년 간 유럽 정치와 경제는 수많은 도전을 겪어 왔다. 아직 불씨가 남은 유로존 재정 위기, '아랍의 봉'에 따른 난민의 대거 유입, 이런 혼란을 틈타 세력을 확장한 극우세력의 발호 등의 문제를 슬기롭게 해결하는 게 지난 60여 년 동안 유럽이 이룬 지역통합의 성과 를 장기적으로 유지하는 데 중요한 정책과제가 돼 왔다. 그런데 이런 과제를 둘러싸고 최 근 유럽에서 나타난 포퓰리즘의 기세가 심상찮아, 유럽의 미래를 위협하고 있다.





SOAS provides 30% discount of the 1-year MA program tuition: i.e., GBP 23,800 (around 38.5 million KRW) → GBP 16,660 (around 27 million KRW). BK21 KU GSIS is working to provide financial support to be distributed across successful applicants (potentially reaching 20m KRW). Stay tuned. - ◆ Applicable students: KU GSIS students in 1st or 2nd semester
- ◆ September starts 1 year at KU, 1 year at SOAS, final 6 months at KU
- (It is possible to get both degrees at least in total 2.5 years.)
