Finally, KUGSIS has been selected to implement the KOICA-KUGSIS scholarship in the field of Finance and Tax Policy. This program is being well proceeded since it was begun in September 2017. We hope to organize and share interesting and meaningful events with you. In this vein, I sincerely ask you to actively engage with your alma mater. I would love to hear crispy suggestions from all of you.



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## FOLLOW-UP PROGRAM ON KOICA-KU MASTERS' DEGREE PROGRAM IN ECONOMIC POLICY DEVELOPMENT: ADDIS ABABA 2016



Early October 2016, I found myself on a long haul flight aboard Ethiopian Airlines from Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia to Addis Ababa, Ethiopia for a very exciting re-union of some sort event. The event was the Follow-Up Program on KOICA-KU Masters' Degree Program in Economic Policy Development (Africa). It was held in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia from 3-8 October 2016. The Follow Up Program was organised as a way of finding out the effectiveness of the sponsorship programs of KOICA and KU.

The Follow-Up Program was attended by fifteen African participants drawn from the pioneer group of 2007 through to 2015. I studied at Korea University as the 2nd group, 2008-2009. It was a good time meeting with other KOICA scholarship beneficiaries, especially from KU. I personally knew three of the participants, 2 from Tanzania and 1 from Kenya from our time in Korea. I was also selected as one of the three Alumni speakers during the event. The other two were from Cameroon and Egypt. The Program comprised of presentations from KU Faculty and invited resource persons as well as site visits in Addis Ababa. Presenters dwelt on a number of areas and some of the topics that I found beneficial among others were:

- The future of development assistance vis-vis the African Agenda 2063;
- The independence of Official Development Assistance (ODA) in the presence of high politics;
- Trade and development;
- Human Rights issues and development;
- Sustainability of ODA in turbulent global economies;
- Conducting baseline surveys;
- Urbanisation, Migration and Development with Korea as a case study; and
- Governance and Development.

The Organisers also arranged visits to the Economic Commission for Africa (ECA) where the participants were addressed by one of the Directors Dr. Jimmy Ocitti. It was quite an informative and insightful discussion where participants were afforded an opportunity to deliberate on Africa economic



development, an issue that is so dear to many countries with practitioners on the ground. ECA outlined a number of programs and assistance that are being implemented and offered in various countries. The group left the session with renewed optimism on Africa.




The Follow-Up Program also offered an opportunity to network with other KU Alumni. I also recall the Alumni having lively and passionate debates on subjects that included among others Leadership, Development, Human Rights, Education as well as Conflicts in Africa. It was refreshing to note that the whole bunch of us exhibited strong love towards the Motherland, Africa, and yearned that a different story be told.

Some of the takeaways from these debates were that Africa needed to take responsibility of charting her own destiny; that it was high time Africans tell our story rather than wait for the outside world to portray what they think; that there were a lot of positives developments in a number of countries; that Africans need to build networks as building blocks for development and that African diversity should not be viewed as a source of conflict but rather, should be a used as a source of dynamism for development.

On a social level, it was also encouraging to note that a number of KOICA-KU beneficiaries had moved up the ladder in terms of career progression. Interestingly, quite a sizeable number have joined the diplomatic arena of their respective countries.

At the end of the Program, as an assessment, the participants were given a group assignment to draft a Project Proposal for possible consideration by KOICA. The interesting dimension to the group set up was mixing up people from different countries. I was put in a group of 3 with participants from Kenya. It really tested the ability to cooperate and coordinate across space drafting this project. In the end it was a happy ending as our proposal of TVET Institution was deemed to be one of the best drafted.



I would like to commend KOICA and KU for organising the Follow-Up Program. I think it is a very noble undertaking that needs to be regularly done. Besides tracking the progress of their beneficiaries, it creates a strong network of the Alumni.

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## OUR EXPERIENCE IN PARTICIPATING IN A FOLLOW-UP PROGRAM ON KOICA-KU MASTER'S DEGREE PROGRAM IN ETHIOPIA



In October 2016, Tanzania alumni students (Alexander Costantine, Ombeni Mwasha, Peter Enos and Frank Mwega) were invited to attend a follow-up program on KOICA-KU Master's Degree Program in Economic Policy and Development (Africa). The program was conducted in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia for 6 days, from 3 to 8 October 2016. The program was organized by Korea University in collaboration with KOICA and was attended by 16 alumni students from Kenya, Zimbabwe, Ghana, Rwanda, Egypt, Cameroon, Algeria, Tunisia, Ethiopia and Tanzania. The purpose of the program was to train the alumni students on key issues of international development and cooperation, discover African development projects that can be implemented by KOICA and

GSIS in the future and investigate the effectiveness of scholarship program in achieving high level human resources.

The training was conducted by Korea University professors and other invited guest speakers. Given their experience and professional expertise on key issues on international development and cooperation, the knowledge we acquired was enormous despite the limited time. It was through the program we were able to come up with a proposal on Leather Industrial Park/Cluster Project in Dodoma region in Tanzania. The proposal was reviewed

and accepted by professors, and it will be presented to KOICA for funding. Accordingly, we were awarded some money for our initiatives and two professors, Cuz Potter and Lee Jing sang visited Tanzania to assess the feasibility of the project. They had meeting with top government officials from the Ministry of Trade, Industries and Investment to discuss about the project. Their suggestions and recommendations about the project were crucial and we incorporated them to the proposal. Our government on the other hand, assured them of its determination to support the project. We hope that the project will be implemented soon and we are happy that we are the source of this mega project and our names will be written in the history of our country. We thank, Korea University and KOICA for organizing this program and for giving us this opportunity.



Indeed, the KOICA/KU Master's Program has been very successful in creating high level human resources. According to the evaluation result presented during the program and discussion we had with other alumni students, much has been realized. Most alumni students are progressing well toward holding higher position, some have enormous contribution in policy decision and knowledge sharing in their respective countries. We are very thankful to KOICA and Korea University not only for the Master's program but also for organizing the follow-up program. It was an important avenue for networking after bringing the alumni students together. Also, an avenue for some of us to meet again and share experiences after graduation.

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Hello, fellow Alumni, I hope you are all doing great. Its Rejoice here and welcome to my short story and I hope you enjoy it. Let me tell you this, my experience in Korea can simply be described as "home away from home". I had a second family, just check it out here, wow. In fact, with my new friends, I did enjoy many wonderful activities. Skiing in the Jisan ski resort was one of my unique






