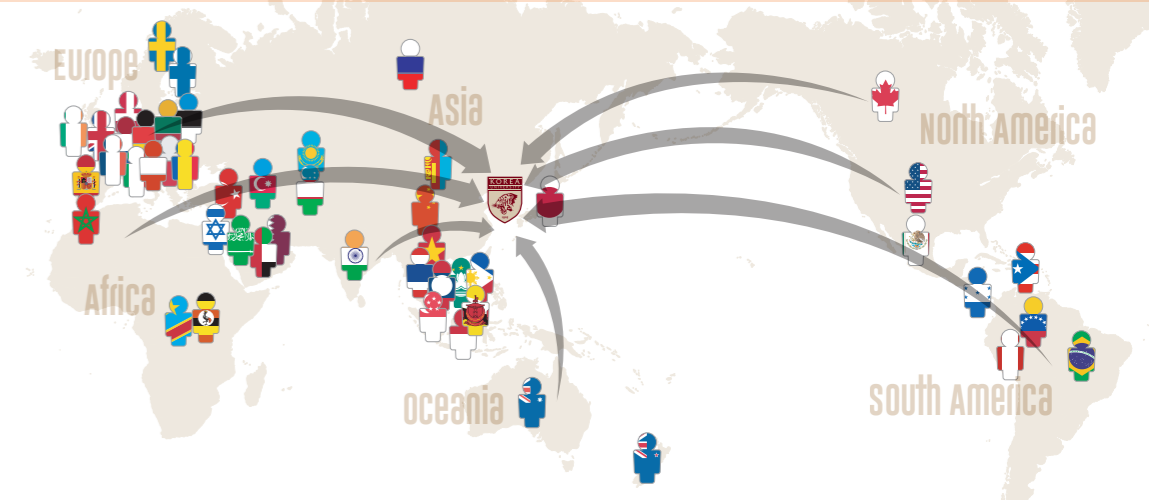

JANUARY 7 – MAY 15, 2020

## ELIGIBILITY

### For KU ISC

- Students currently enrolled in a college/university

### For KU ISC Pre-College Program

- Academically motivated high school students

- High school graduates who never attended college-level institutions (under the age of 19)



## APPLICATION MATERIALS

- 1 Copy of Academic Transcript
- 2 Copy of Passport
- 3 Proof of Health Insurance
- 4 Consent Letter signed by a legal guardian (Only for pre-college students)

## APPLICATION PROCEDURES

- 1 Complete all-in-one online application form at [summerkorea.ac.kr](http://summerkorea.ac.kr)
  - ※ Students may choose their course selection and housing option on the online application form
  - ※ Eligible students may apply for the internship on the same application form
- 2 Pay the application fee of KRW 100,000 (Non-refundable)
- 3 Send the required documents to [isc@korea.ac.kr](mailto:isc@korea.ac.kr)
- 4 Receive the Letter of Acceptance via Email
- 5 Pay the tuition, housing fee and all other remaining fees

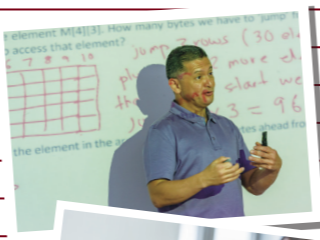
## FINANCIAL BENEFITS (INTERNATIONAL FEE-PAYING STUDENTS ONLY)

**Early Registration Benefit: KRW200,000**  
Students who register for KU ISC 2020 by Feb. 29 are eligible for the Early Registration Benefit.

**Re-Enrollment Benefit: KRW 100,000**  
Students who have participated in KU ISC/IWC in the past are eligible for Re-Enrollment Benefit.

## COURSE LOAD

4-Week program: 150 minutes per class X 16 classes

6-Week program: 100 minutes per class X 24 classes

## CREDIT

For credit transfer, students are advised to consult with appropriate academic authorities at their home institution in advance with a course description or syllabus uploaded on KU ISC website.

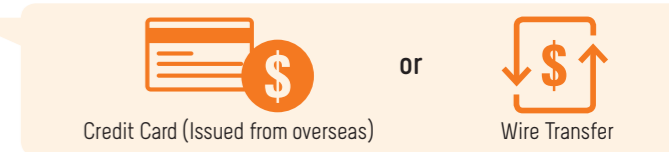

## ALUMNI SCHOLARSHIP

Children of Korea University alumni are eligible for a scholarship of KRW 200,000 – 400,000.

※ The amount of the scholarship varies and depends on the number of courses that students take.

## U21 / APRU SCHOLARSHIP

Students coming from U21 or APRU member institutions may receive a Fellowship Fund of either KRW 200,000 or KRW 400,000 depending on the students' home universities.
