 - Field of Social and industrial problem



1. Glocal Conflict Management


➤ What is glocal conflict management?

Glocal conflict is a conflict that combines globality and locality in social, political, and economic aspects. It refers to the factors that cause domestic problems affected by global phenomena and current issues.

1. Participants Support Program

➤ Who is the participant?

: A full-time graduate student led by a professor participating in the BK21 project (less than two years master's degree and four doctorate years students) who is able to devote more than 40 hours per week to related research and classes is a participant

> Benefits for participants

- ✓ Support for domestic and overseas academic conference participation fees and expenses
- ✓ Support short-term (about a week) field trip expenses
- ✓ Support for participation in overseas education program
- ✓ Support research activities of graduate student
 - Support publication of academic articles in a refereed-journal
 - Provide incentives for publication of academic articles in a refereed-journal
 - Hold colloquiums and special lectures by experts

2. BK21 Glocal Fellowship Program

➤ Who is the fellow?

- : The fellow is a participant who receives a scholarship
- ✓ 18 enrolled students in the third and fourth semesters of the <u>master's program</u> will be selected by participating professors

➤ Benefits for fellows

- ✓ All benefits for participants
- ✓ Fellowship (6 months)
 - Master's student: \forall 700,000/mo

3. Responsibilities of Participants and Fellows

> Responsibilities of both participants and fellows

: We anticipate both participants and fellows to participate actively in seminars, special lectures provided by experts, and workshops hosted by KU GSIS BK21 Program of Glocal Studies

- ➤ Additional responsibilities for the fellows
 - ✓ Acquisition of "glocal conflict management expert" certificate (mandatory for Masters)
 - (* Applicable to students entering the 1st semester of 2021)
 - Take courses certified by "glocal conflict management expert"
 - At least 5 courses for a master's student
 (including 2 or more subjects from "General Conflict Management Policy Analysis")
 - Internship in a local government
 - ✓ Require to select thesis track (Master's program)

- > Required Documents
 - ✓ Participants
 - Participant Application Form
 - Agreement on the collection, use, and provision of personal information
 - One of the following
 - 1. Certificate of 4 major social security insurance (issued within October 2020)
 - 2. Confirmation of Insurance (issued within October 2020)
 - 3. D-2 Student Visa Document

(a copy on both sides of an Alien Registration Card or a copy of D-2 Visa on a passport)
