However, exchange students are expected to mainly choose courses offered by GSAPS. Courses selected outside of the school cannot exceed 50% of the total credits registered. This rule does not apply to the courses by the center for Japanese Language and the Global

Education Center. Course Requirements

> MA Students: As a rule, exchange students are required to register for a Project Research Seminar(Zemi), for which they shall receive grades, but credits won't be given. The exchange coordinator needs to nominate students by sending an email to gsaps-ac@list.waseda.jp with students' information (name and email Nomination address). We will then send the online application link to the coordinator. Please share the link with the applicants.

◆ Paper-based Application The applicant sends necessary documents via postal mail.

7	Three copies of ID photos (Taken within the past three months)
8	Documents to prove that applicants can defray all the expenses incurred during their stay in Japan (Bank Statement etc.) *Over 1,500,000 JPY is preferrable.

The GSAPS Office will send you "the Letter of Acceptance" once your enrollment is officially approved.

The participants will be asked to complete the necessary procedures for the visit.

Before Arrival

* The GSAPS Office will apply for the Certificate of Eligibility which is necessary for you to apply for a student visa at the local embassy/consulate of Japan. You are required to obtain a student visa prior to departure in accordance with the directions by the GSAPS Office.

* The participants need to purchase an overseas travel insurance covering the entire duration of the stay, from departure to return to the country of their home university. Please note that even if you are covered by insurance of your country, you are required to be covered by Japanese health insurance too. They must bear the cost.

FAQ

Q1: Is it possible for exchange students to take courses offered by other graduate schools of Waseda University?

A1: Yes, but please note that it's very limited and not all courses are available. Refer to the designated list on the website. Exchange students are expected to mainly choose courses offered by GSAPS. Courses selected outside of the school cannot exceed 50% of the total credits registered. This rule does not apply to the courses by the center for Japanese Language and the Global Education Center.

Q2: Do you provide international students with Japanese language classes?

A2: Yes, there are Japanese language courses available. Credits and grades will be given. However, please note that you may not be able to take your preferred courses due to the limited availability and levels of courses.

Q3: Can I get a part-time job?

A3: Yes, you can work part-time under the regulations. Please see the URL below for more details. http://www.cie-waseda.jp/visastatus/en/current/parttimeworkpermission.html

Q4: I am a Ph.D. student and would like to choose a supervisor from another graduate school at Waseda for my research. Is this possible?

 $\ensuremath{\mathsf{A4}}\xspace$ No, your supervisor should be one of the professors of GSAPS.

Q5: Can I travel abroad during the semester?

A5: You can travel abroad and re-enter in Japan at your expense as long as you have a student visa and follow the designated procedures. Please inform your supervisor/course instructors/the GSAPS Office of the plan in advance so that we all know your whereabouts. Please be aware that your absence might negatively affect your grades and be insured for any accidents.

Q6: How long can I stay at Waseda as a student?

A6: Student registration will expire on September 15th (Spring Semester exchange)/March 15th (Fall Semester exchange). You are required to leave Japan in a timely manner despite of the visa expiry

Q7: Do I have to purchase an overseas travel insurance?

A7: Yes. All exchange students must buy an overseas travel insurance prior to their arrival, which covers the whole period of the stay. In addition, you need to apply for the National Health Insurance in Japan after your arrival.

You also have to submit a copy of the insurance card to the GSAPS Office on your arrival. Q8: I don't belong to a GSAPS partner school. Can I apply for the exchange program?

A8: No, only students from GSAPS partner schools can apply for this program.

Q9: I have a Bachelor/Master degree from a university in an English speaking country. Do I have to submit an English proficiency test result?

A9: A photocopy of your diploma is acceptable. If you have any scorecard to submit, however, please submit it.

Q10: Can I enter Japan without a student visa and apply for one after I enter Japan?

A10. No. You must get a student visa prior to your arrival.

Q11: By when should I arrive at Japan?

All. You are required to be in Japan by the orientation which will be conducted in early April for Spring exchange, in mid-September for Fall exchange.
